Digital Switchover

The Digital Switchover in the Granada TV region begins on 4 November 2009, when the analogue BBC2 signal will cease. On 2 December the remaining analogue channels will also be switched off.

Residents with Freeview, Top Up TV or BT Vision will need to re-scan programmes regularly from 30 September 2009.

All non-digital TV's and recorders will need a digibox to receive the channels and these can be obtained for around £20 from most major supermarkets or electrical retailers. You will NOT be able to record one programme whilst watching another, even with a digibox.

Most homes will not need replacement aerials so don't fall for any sharp sales practice from TV aerial suppliers.
