This year we have asked for a bus stop sign to be painted on Blackburn Road, for the stop up from the Red Lion and for the pavements to be 'reclaimed' (from vegetation and soil etc at the foot of the hedges) between Ryecroft and the top of Blackburn Road and on Chapel Lane.
