Recycling

With Christmas approaching residents are asked to recycle as much as they can.

The large amounts of cardboard packaging from presents will be collected by Chorley Council, as will the empty wine, spirit and beer bottles, cans and paper and, don't forget, many supermarkets offer Christmas card recycling facilities.

Lancashire has one of the best recycling rates in the country but large amounts of plastics still go to landfill because we are unsure which can be recycled - so here is a quick guide (not a comprehensive list so check packaging for the recyclable sign). Lancashire currently has facilities for recycling the following categories of plastics:



PET (polyethylene terephthalate) - fizzy drinks bottles, oven ready meal trays



HDPE (high density polyethylene) - bottles for milk and washing-up liquids



PVC (polyvinyl chloride) - food trays, cling film, squash bottles, mineral water, shampoo
