Housing Needs in Heapey

It is important that people are able to find housing that meets their own needs. In rural areas it is sometimes difficult for people to find something suitable because there very limited choice, and it is often unobtainable by the existing residents when they need to move house. To help learn more about housing need in Heapey, Chorley Council is conducting a Rural Housing Needs Study. This will be done in the autumn.

A large part of this study will be a confidential survey of households to highlight need in relation to areas such as:

- New household formation (e.g. children growing up in your community need their own home).
- Housing for households who have outgrown their current accommodation.
- Housing to meet the needs of older people.

Property types, tenure types (such as buying, renting or shared ownership) and affordability will all be included in the study. Your help in completing the questionnaires is vital to making sure we can meet the housing needs of people in the parish both now and in the future. Please complete the form and return it in the Freepost envelope provided by 12 November 2010.

Although the survey is confidential, we understand that you may not wish to answer all the questions, but we would still welcome returned forms that are not entirely complete. Keep Your Right to Vote

Up to the end of October each household is being delivered with an electoral registration from Chorley Council.

Householders are required, by law, to provide the information requested on the forms and, even if there are no changes since last year, you still need to provide it.

If you are not on the register you will not be able to vote. Not being registered can also affect your credit rating making it difficult to take out loans, mortgages or other credit facilities.
