Council Tax Down!

Following on from a zero increase last year the Parish Council's precept for the next financial year shows a reduction of almost 4%, to £8990, from £9360 in 2010-11.

Services provided by the Parish Council from the precept include mowing of grass verges on Blackburn Road, wayside seats, the Christmas trees and lights, Parish Council noticeboards, relevant insurance cover, contributions towards the ongoing provision of the Heapey and Wheelton Play Area and maintenance of the War Memorial Grounds and, for 2011-12, the trialing of the Parish Council's own grit bin scheme. Assistance is also provided for the upkeep of the Village Hall and War Memorial. Heapey and Wheelton Parish Councils are joint trustees of, with ultimate responsibility for, Heapey and Wheelton Village Hall, but this is run and maintained, on a day to day basis, by a separate Committee.
