Annual Report

2010 saw the project to provide a Christmas Tree at the entrance to Heapey Chase come to fruition and the tree and lights attracted a number of positive comments from residents. The extreme winter weather did provide a marvellous backdrop for the Tree.

The scheme to improve the play area with our colleagues at Wheelton Parish Council was also completed during the year.

The Council continued with its support of our local amenities, with contributions being made towards the upkeep of the War Memorial, and the play area, and to other local organisations.

2010 was also an election year for the Council and we said goodbye to long serving Councillor, Joan Geddes, and Peter Church. We welcomed our new members Malcolm Allen and Colin Grunstein, who were co-opted to the Council at the July meeting.

2011 will see the beginning of the Parish Council grit bin scheme. We have tried, unsuccessfully, to get Lancashire County Council to provide additional bins to their existing ones on Ryefield, Chapel lane and Coppice Lane so we now intend to provide two bins, complete with grit, for residents on Heapey Chase to spread on the roads in their neighbourhoods. If this proves successful, we will be looking to add to the number of grit bins in future years.

The Council is extremely keen to try to engage with our residents and, in order to do this we really need feedback and input from as many as possible. If there are any issues which concern you, or items you think the Parish Council might help with or take up on your behalf please let us know.

Road Closures 31 July 2011

There will be a number of roads closed in short duration, between 6.00am and 4.00pm, to allow the safe passage of participants in the Bolton Ironman UK Triathlon Event. Roads affected in the immediate vicinity include:
