Dog Control Orders

Chorley Council has recently introduced three new Dog Control Orders for dogs in public areas within the borough:

The Dogs on Leads Order requires dogs to be on leads on adopted roads with a speed limit of less than 40mph, and on footpaths and associated verges. Also on any public open space when an organised activity is in progress eg football game, car boot sale, educational activities etc. and land used for the consumption of food or drink in connection with any trade, business or undertaking supplying food or drink. Dogs must also be kept on leads in bus or rail stations and cemeteries.

The Dogs on Leads by Direction Order gives Chorley Council Officers powers to direct someone to place their dog on a lead in any public open space if the dog is, in the opinion of the Officer, causing a nuisance to other users of that space. The Order applies to <u>all</u> open air land throughout the borough to which members of the public are allowed access with or without payment.

The Dogs Exclusion Order applies only to Chorley Council owned land and includes play facilities and cemeteries.

A £75 fixed penalty will be issued for breaching any of the above Orders and anyone failing to pay the Fixed Penalty within 14 days will be liable, upon prosecution, to a maximum fine of £1000.
